THE PROMISE

"Be an imitator of those who through faith and patience, inherit the promises" – The Writer of Hebrews

Consider the following: How do you personally respond when facing a trial or crisis? Are your responses deliberate or unpredictable? Do you take action, or do you feel helpless? What about your emotions... are they cool, calm and collected, or filled with stress and anxiety, or perhaps even anger? How satisfied have you been with your method of response and the resulting outcomes?

Over the years I have observed a great contrast in human response to the trials and challenges that confront us. As a result of these observations, as well as personal experiences, I have learned that the outcome of any challenge is significantly tied to the response given it.

While specific responses are virtually unlimited in possibility, I have found that any response has a tendency to fall into one of two predominant and opposing categories: faith-based or fear-based.

Consider the differences: Faith refreshes, and ultimately delivers, while fear grips and ultimately destroys!

When a person chooses to believe in a positive outcome through faith, it births hope and hope inspires and fuels the journey toward the goal of what is expected through faith. The outcomes of faith-based action are overwhelmingly positive and at times even miraculous! Fear-based response on the other hand, while it could motivate one into taking an initial action, many times immobilizes and keeps a person from taking any action at all, and leaves them in a realm of self-pity, depression or worse.

What a contrast between these two approaches! Why would everyone not respond out of faith instead out of fear when confronted with their problems, especially when there is solid evidence that faithful responses bring about more successful outcomes? Perhaps some are not sure what they believe. Others may not know what to have faith in. Still others may be unsure what faith is all about. In fact, the entire issue of "faith" is oftentimes confusing and difficult to wrap our minds around.

There is much to learn about faith from the Old Testament account of Iob. Iob was a man of integrity, upright in all his ways. In fact, he was described as the "most righteous" man in all the land. In addition to being a man of great character, he was also a man of great wealth. His possessions were vast in number and he had many servants.

One day, in the midst of his great success, calamity struck with a vengeance. In a matter of hours, one catastrophe after another stripped him of everything he owned! Shortly thereafter, boil-like sores broke out all over his body. Next, his wife and friends turned on him and accused him falsely of things he must have done to have brought such calamity upon himself! Even though Job was financially, physically and emotionally devastated, he chose to respond out of faith and not out of fear in the midst of his dire circumstances.

As a result of Job's "faith" response to these challenges – a response he persisted in each and every day - he was rewarded with the restoration of his health and the doubling of the great wealth he once had. What was this faith that Job had and where did he get it?

Job simply chose to believe in the Promises of God that are recorded in the most published book in the history of the world – the Bible.

No matter how devastating his circumstances, he made a conscious decision to believe in the Promises, rather than what he visually saw, emotionally felt or had a tendency to otherwise believe.

Job's is not an isolated story of overcoming challenging circumstances through faith. There are many miraculous stories of how faith delivers people today from dismal circumstances. I have also experienced the power of faith when I chose to believe in the Promises for deliverance from a deadly medical prognosis.

In 2001 I was diagnosed with *severe* aplastic anemia, an autoimmune disease that attacks the bone marrow and related stem cells. In a period of three short weeks this deadly disease killed all my bone marrow, left me with no immune system and completely altered the course of my life.

Blood tests revealed a neutrophil count of 0.0; meaning there was no means of fighting any germ or infection that might be

encountered. As a result, I was confined to a special "neutropenic" room in the hospital that was designed to minimize possible germ contact. There were precautionary signs posted outside my door; "No fresh fruits or flowers" and "Please see nurse before entering".

No blood cells were being produced as a result of this disease, so I required blood transfusions every 3-4 days. My siblings were tested and worldwide databases were searched for a possible bone marrow donor. None was ever found. While in their care, the doctors said things such as, "You are like a guy that got hit by lightning", and "You have an unfortunate case of bad luck", and "We are sorry, we wish there was something we could do". None of the specialists were able to determine why the disease struck me, nor did they offer any hope.

After nearly a month in the hospital the doctors informed me that I could not stay there indefinitely and was sent home with these instructions: "Stay away from your kids, do not kiss your wife, get rid of your pets, and do not go out in public". The doctors warned of the many ways the disease could bring about death, and that it

was only a matter of time before I would succumb to one of them.

I had a choice as to how I was going to respond. I made a deliberate choice to have faith in the Promises and not allow the fear of the circumstances to gain the advantage it sought.

My choice became a daily, even an hourly exercise of determination as I fought fear with faith. To better help do this I followed the same approach I have always done in life and business: I wrote out a plan that outlined my expectation of being healed. I selected Promises that pertained to physical healing and believed they were meant for me. Each day I verbalized these Promises along with positive affirmations that I developed. As I did this, fear fled, faith rose up and hope inspired me to where I knew I would and not merely could, be healed!

This faith-based, deliberate response produced results – incredible results. Four months after the disease struck and 41 blood transfusions later, my expected miracle arrived! Without medical intervention or explanation, bone marrow began to grow

where none existed and began to produce strong, healthy blood cells to the amazement of the doctors.

I was completely healed from the disease and restored to health through prayer and faith in the Promises! My example proves once again that nothing is impossible to those who believe in the Promises!

The Bible defines faith as "the evidence of things not seen, and the substance of things hoped for". This means that one must believe that he has that which he seeks before the evidence or substance has appeared! This must become a conviction, for it is the key to unlocking the divine power of the Promises!

Then, out of conviction, one must take action by living and speaking words that are consistent with the Promises. For it is written, "Faith without works (action) is dead (useless), being by itself."

Below are just a few of the many affirmations and Promises that I wrote on Post-it-Notes and displayed in various locations within my home in 2001. I made a point of speaking these out several times each day with boldness, confidence and expectation that they would become a reality in my life!

- My body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, where no darkness or disease can dwell!
- I know the plans I have for you says the Lord, plans for hope and a future!
- No weapon formed against me shall prosper!
- Jesus came to give LIFE and give it abundantly! Thank you, Lord for an abundant life!
- My immune system is working perfectly!
- Thank you, Father, for planting fresh, clean, strong bone marrow in my bones!
- I thank you Lord, for full and complete healing! According to Your Promise – I am healed!
- And the man said, "Lord, if thou will, you can make me whole." And Jesus said, "I WILL!"

There is no mountain so high you cannot climb it, no valley so low you cannot travel its barren ground, and no ocean so deep you cannot navigate its rough waters.

I have had the privilege of walking through the valley of the shadow of death and have experienced the miraculous power as a result of faith in the Promises. The Promises can and will produce miracles in your life and is your unmatched weapon in overcoming fear and rising above any challenge you may be facing now or in the future.

Having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is essential to receiving all the benefits God has to offer you – both in this life and the life to come. For Jesus said, "... I came that you might have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).
